

Each work of the flesh is based on the intent of Fear in that it generates a mind set of “what is not”, feeling the need to gain that he does not possess. Once we accept that mind set of what is not, we will then find ourselves in a conquest of power and therefore function in the Intent of that Fear. Take note of the intent of Fear in conquest of the power to satisfy self, as found in the list in Galatians 5:21ff.

- Adultery: Based on the intent of Fear in a conquest of the power of the sexual desire to possess power over that I have or do not have to satisfy self pleasure.
- Fornication: Based on the intent of Fear in an uncontrolled sexual power to satisfy the flesh in unnatural sex acts to the pleasures to the flesh.
- Uncleanness: Based on the intent of Fear in that of being controlled sexually.
- Licentiousness: Bases on the intent Fear of not being in your own power. I believe that I am in control of my own life, and choose neither to submit to God nor anyone else seeking to control me.
- Idolatry: Based on the intent of Fear of being controlled by God and believing I have the power to create and serve the God of self creation.
- Sorcery: Based on the intent of Fear in full conquest for the power to be as God and through Rebellion, in defiance of God.
- Hatred: Based on the intent of Fear through self power and feels challenged in what is not my way therefore I hate the other way and feel threatened.

Contentions:	Based on the Intent of Fear of being wrong, challenging any power or authority not agreeing with me. A defiant spirit.
Emulations:	Based on the intent of Fear of that I don't have therefore exercising the power to trouble that that is good and seeking to diminish it, i.e. "If I can't have it neither should you!"
Wrath:	Based on the intent of Fear by reacting or demonstrating my power when feeling my power is being challenged. The emotion will often react in outburst.
Strife:	Based on the intent of Fear of being wrong, will quarrel to prove self to make self look good. Again a spirit of defiance.
Seditions:	Based on the intent of Fear of what I don't possess, uses self power of selfishness to control another by division.
Heresies:	Based on the intent of Fear found in the pride of the mind, using the power to speak ideas to serve self.
Envy:	Based on the intent of Fear of being alone and selfishness in that one cannot be happy knowing that someone else has what they do not have.
Murders:	Based on the intent of Fear of being destroyed, reacts by demonstration power to kill, and feels challenged by competition
Drunkenness:	Based on the intent of Fear of loneliness seeking self pleasure, feeling powerless.

Revelries: Based on the intent of Fear of being controlled, seeks no commitment, will seek anything to avoid commitment in life.

The intent of the basic motivation of the flesh is to seek the big "I" or to satisfy the desires of the flesh. All of the fruits of the flesh are based on gratification of self, first and foremost and exercises his power to accomplish them. Paul listed them to show a sharp contrast to the fruits of the Spirit or what the Spirit will produce in the spirit of the redeemed person.

## Second: The fruits of the Spirit of the redeemed man.

In Galatians 5:22-23 we find what a living spirit filled with the Holy Spirit will produce when one is submitted to the power and authority of Jesus Christ. I have already established that he who controls the spirit of man will control the soul of man thus the fruit of the soul. We find that when man gets redeemed the basic intent of the spirit changes. It changes in that we have been given a new spirit that has never sinned and then filled with the Holy Spirit for new life. The basic intent of motivation of our being has changed. When we accept the Lordship of Jesus Christ the intent of our being is changed to one of submission to the power and authority of Jesus. We no longer have a conquest for power but a submission to the power of God and learn to live in the assumption of that power in us. We still live in the flesh of the old man but now have the mind of Christ in our spirit to counteract the flesh. The unredeemed man is at the whim of his father the Devil, and does not have the choice of the intent of life as that of redeemed Saints. We now have a choice, to serve the Spirit or to serve the flesh. We will either choose the conquest of power or surrender to the power of the Lordship of Jesus with the quest to learn more about living in the Kingdom and walking in the power of the Holy Spirit. Serving the flesh has always caused man to think of that he doesn't have or can't do and seek the power to change i.e. "Turn over a new leaf"! Anytime we find our thinking in terms of that which I do not have, I am thinking from the intent of the flesh and it will always create despair and a sense of failure. The Spirit of God always seeks for us to be transformed by the **renewing** of our mind. (Romans 12:1-2)
